Phonology What is the definition of Phonology? The word phonology comes from Greek *phōnē*, "voice, sound", and the suffix -logy (which is from Greek *logos*, "word, speech, subject of discussion"). Phonology is a specialized study of the way sounds are organized in a language.

Generative phonology posits two levels of phonological representation: An underlying representation is the most basic form of a word before any phonological rules have been applied to it. Underlying representations show what a native speaker knows about the abstract underlying phonology of the language.
